COMMISSION ON JUDICIAL PERFORMANCE ANNOUNCES PUBLIC MEETING USING REMOTE TECHNOLOGY (ZOOM)

As part of its 2020 biennial rules review process, the Commission on Judicial Performance will hold a public meeting using remote technology (Zoom) to discuss proposed rules changes, operational statistics, and complaint data trends. The public meeting will take place on September 15, 2020, at 10:00 a.m. and will last one hour.

In addition, due to commission rule 102 governing confidentiality, all comments and questions must be submitted for consideration in advance by sending an email to publicmeeting@cjp.ca.gov no later than 5:00 p.m. September 10, 2020.

Policy Declaration 3.5 of the Commission on Judicial Performance provides that every two years, in even-numbered years, the commission should review its rules and any proposed enactments, amendments or repeals, and seek public comment.
